## **Nonfiction Features**

## THESE NONFICTION FEATURES ORGANIZE THE BOOK AND HELP READERS KNOW WHAT IS IMPORTANT

<u>Captions/Labels:</u> Help you better understand a picture or photograph

Glossary: Helps you define words that are in the book

<u>Charts/Graphs:</u> Charts, graphs, or cutaways are used to help you understand what the author is trying to tell you

Maps: help you to understand where places are in the world

<u>Illustrations/Photographs:</u> Help you to know exactly what something looks like

<u>Index:</u> This is an alphabetical list of ideas that are in the book. It tells you what page the idea is on.

Labels: These help you identify a picture or a photograph and its parts

<u>Special Print:</u> When a word is **bold**, in *italics*, or <u>underlined</u>, it is an <u>important</u> word for you to know

<u>Headings:</u> These titles help you to know what the next section will be about

<u>Table of Contents</u>: Helps you identify key topics in the book in the order they are presented

Bullets/Asterisks/Stars: These symbols help to identify key points

Timelines: Helps the reader to see data in a chronological sequence
